



Black Rock College Does 'IT' Remotely

Blackrock College students are now getting "hands on" training in the teaching classrooms using NetSupport School in their computer-training lab.

NetSupport School is an interactive software solution that enables teachers and trainers to demonstrate, monitor and interact with their students, simply and effectively. This can be done on a whole class basis or to selected groups of students or even to individual students. Teachers can directly assist students, sharing control of the keyboard and mouse and answering questions through computer chats to enhance learning on a one to one or one to many basis.

The key features that differentiated NetSupport School were ease of implementation and use, the ability to show teacher's screen to student screens, view multiple student screens for monitoring, two-way chat and messaging, and file distribution so teachers could send out files and collect course work at the end of class. We have an overhead projector so it's possible to display to the class the problem and solution if warranted".
